



ADAPT-r Call for Experienced Researcher - deadline 13 January 2014

ADAPT-r is a €4M FP7 Marie Curie Initial Training Network offering a new approach to PhD training for creative practitioners and will offer 40 Fellowships, 7 training conferences, a major research conference, a major exhibition, five key books, and a website providing public access to research and events. ADAPT-r commenced on 1 January 2013 and will run over four years. ADAPT-r is a network of 7 Partner Institutions and SME Associate Partner institutions (Architecture, design and art practices).

Experienced Researcher

Following contractual EC regulations, an Experienced Researcher within the Marie Curie framework is defined as means a researcher who, at the time of recruitment is:

- 1) in possession of a doctoral degree, independently of the time taken to acquire it, or has at least four years of full-time equivalent research experience *and*
- 2) has less than five years of full-time equivalent research experience.

Description

This is the second of several anticipated calls for applications from researchers in architecture, design and art for a total of 7 fellowships. These 2 specific Experienced Research fellowships concern employment for a period of 12 months at Aarhus School of Architecture, Denmark and The University of Westminster, England starting between February and July 2014.

Applications are open to those who have already completed a cognate practice-based PhD or who have between four and five years of full-time equivalent research experience.

The experienced researchers will contribute to several of the project work packages. They have to become resident in the country of the hosting universities.

Selection Criteria

Selection will be based on research potential, the formal requirements for the position as well as affinity with the idea of 'venturous' practice and the ADAPT-r project. Successful applicants must demonstrate a consistent and systematic approach that 'tests' the edges of the discipline. Selection will be merit based and candidates will be ranked against the criteria.

Submission requirements

Applicants should provide a description of their research experience and initial ideas concerning the research for the ADAPT-r project (no more than 500 words). This can include art prizes, publication in professional or Art journals, selected or invited exhibitions of work, significant commissions, other publications including books, book chapters and journal articles either by the applicant or about the work of the applicant will be considered as evidence of peer recognition and can be used to demonstrate the venturous quality of the work.

In addition the applicant must provide:

The names and contact information of two people who are willing to provide references.

A list and proof of applicants qualifications.

A statement confirming more than four years formal research experience and less than five.

Complete contact information along with dates available for commencement.

Applications must be submitted electronically to adapt-r@luca-arts.be with the subject title "Application for Marie Curie Research Fellow Position (ESR)" on 13 January 2014 prior to 17:00 Belgian time, which is the deadline for the submission of the applications. Notification of receipt of submission will be returned to the applicant on submission.
