The Mackintosh School of Architecture has been taking part in a practice-based doctoral program in cooperation with a network of international architecture schools, as a partner of ADAPT-r project.

The core feature of the methodological model offered by ADAPT-r and the Mackintosh School of Architecture is that new knowledge is developed by reflection on, through and for creative practice.

The upcoming ADAPT-r Days aim to give an insight into practitioners' diverse approach in conducting their PhDs, related challenges, and discoveries.

The topic of the event, “Mentors, epiphanies and side-tracks of the research”, urges the presenters and the audience to reveal their journey through the research and the practice through a reflection on the role of the mentors in the creative practice research.

To do so, the two-day event will be structured into several different ‘episodes’, which can be attended separately or all together, each of which has different purposes in the exploration of the theme.

Every event involved different actors from the multiform ecology of the ADAPT-r network, to give some glimpses in the complexity of the programme.

On the **27th** the Experienced Researchers, Dorotea Ottaviani (GSA), Alice Buoli (Estonian Academy of Arts) and Cecilia De Marinis (RMIT) of the ADAPT-r ITN project will kick off the two-day event by running a **workshop** on the theme of “**Tacit Knowledge and the Mentors**” with the master students, the PhD and the postgraduate community of GSA.

On **the afternoon of the 27th** David Porter, Sally Stewart and Laura Gonzalez and other guests will focus on personal experiences about the role of the Mentors within the innovative frame of the ‘**Research Paper Chase**’ titled “**Mentors, epiphanies and side-tracks of the research**”.

The **morning of the 28th** will be dedicated to a **panel session** in preparation for the PRS (Practice Research Symposium) of November at University of Westminster. Three fellows of the ADAPT-r project, Koen Broucke (GSA), Chris Johnstone (RMIT) and Dermot Foley (RMIT), will present their research to a panel of supervisors.
